Division is functioning in the entire district and it has been designated as Divisional Management Unit for the purpose of implementing the scheme namely Tamilnadu Bio-Diversity Conservation and Greening Project (TBGP) since 2011. At was the officer incharge of Forestry Extension Division and he is responsible for maintaining the accounts of this scheme and he is competent

authority to issue cheques.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> accused Tr.Thangadurai is working as Technical Assistant, Forestry Extension Division, Namakkal from 01.05.2012 to till date. He is responsible for preparing estimate for the expenses during implementation of the scheme and he should present completion report to A1. Both accused are public servants as defined u/s 2(c) of the Prevention of Corruption Act 1988 during the commission of offence.

## About the Scheme:

The Tamil Nadu Forest Department has been implementing the scheme by name "Tamilnadu Biodiversity Conservation And Greening Project (TBGP)" with the external assistance of Japan International Co-Operation Agency from the year 2011-12 to 2018-19 for a period of 8 years at a cost of Rs.686.28 crores vide G.O.(Ms.) No.189 Environment and Forests Department, dated: 20.12.2011. Fund is being released every year out of Rs.686.28 crores based on the approval of high-level committee of the project.

Tree Cultivation in Private Land (TCPL) is one among the component of TBGP. This component involves two stages. One is raising nursery and another one is planting the seedlings of short and long rotation plant species. The Government through the forest department bears the total cost for the above works. As per the government circular, Rs.11.95/- and Rs.19.80/- are being provided for rising of Nursery and for planting respectively for a plant seedling. The Forest Extension Division has to carryout nursery and planting of seedlings at the land of respective farmers.

Project Management Consultants will be engaged as envisaged in the Minutes of Discussion (M.O.D.) and G.O.(Ms.) No.190 Environment and Forests Department, Dated: 20.12.2011, annexed with an Operational Manual for the Project Management Unit of TBGP for assisting in the smooth implementation of the project in the field directly under the supervision and control of the Project Management Unit (P.M.U).

The Project Management Unit (P.M.U.) which is a registered society will implement this project all over the State. The forest divisions, Wildlife and other units will be designated as Divisional Management Units (D.M.U.). Forestry Extension Division in each and every district functions as one of the DMUs for the purpose of implementing this project. Forestry Extension Officer is the officer incharge of Forestry Extension Division. The forest ranges

implementing this project will be designated as Field Management Unit (F.M.U.). The PMU is guided by the High Level Empowered Committee (H.L.E.C.) headed by the Chief Secretary to Government and the Governing Body headed by the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests on all financial and policy issues. The Operational Manual will govern the financial transactions, accounting and auditing. The Project funds will be operated through bank accounts. Apart from the provisions made in the Operational Manual, the DMUs and FMUs shall follow the departmental procedure.

Nursery work is being raised in Forest Extension Centers under the control of Forestry Extension Office in every district and also in private lands on agreement basis. Generally, nursery work (sowing) is carried out during the period between January and March of the every year. Nursery is being maintained between the months of April and August. Plantation work is carried out between August and December. After getting sufficient growth, the plant seedlings are distributed to the farmers based on the numbers which have been obtained during the awareness program conducted. At the time of distribution of plant seedlings a consent letter from farmer, copy of patta and photographs are obtained by the officers of FEO. After attaining sufficient growth of nursery plants, the forest Ranger or Technical Assistant will prepare an estimate for the expenses towards the planting of particular numbers of plant seedlings in a particular Cluster.

If the post of Ranger is vacant, Technical Assistant will do the above work. Rates of all components of works will be calculated as per the forest rates of schedule except transportation during the preparation of estimate. For transportation, quotations have to be obtained from the vehicle owners and the lowest quotation will be approved by the FEO. Based on the above estimate and quotation, FEO will pass Divisional Sanction Order (DSO). An agreement will be made between the FEO and the petty contractors those who are enrolled their names in the Forest Divisional Office or District Forest Office. Sometimes they are identified as petty contractors by the Rangers or FEO even though they did

not register in the offices said above. Then, the above work will be entrusted to them according to the agreement. The petty contractors will carry out the above plantation work including transportation of plant seedlings, unloading and carrying them to farmers place, distribution, marking, aligning and digging 45 cm<sup>3</sup> pits planting the seedlings and manuring the plants. The Ranger or the FEO who is holding additional charge of Ranger will inspect all the places of planting and will confirm the correctness and completion of planting work. Then, he will instruct the concerned Rangers/Technical Assistants to prepare vouchers after getting sub vouchers according to the DSO. As per the manual of operation, the FEO has to give account payee cheques to the petty contractors. After completion of the above transaction, Technical Assistant has to give completion report as the works enumerated in the DSO get completed. All the above plantation works will be assisted by Foresters and Plot Watchers.

Generally, an amount which is credited in the account of FEO's will be transferred to the account of concerned Rangers. The Ranger will draw the amounts through cheques and then distribute the cash to petty contractors after getting proper vouchers. If the post of Ranger is vacant, the FEO will issue the amount to the petty contractors through cheques. He will get proper voucher and will file it. But currently, cash is being issued to the petty contractors by withdrawing amount by FEO's through self cheques.

Funds for this scheme will be deposited in the account opened in the Indian Overseas Bank in the name of Forestry Extensional Divisional Management Unit (FEDMU) TBGP. FEO is only having the power of issuance of cheques from the above account. During the year 2014-15 the Government had proposed to plant 85,000 plant seedlings to Namakkal District, at the cost of Rs.25.5 lakhs.(All including the expenses of nursery and plantation)

During the course of collection of information, the following allegation against the accused noted in the margin has come to light.

The information reveals that during the year 2014-2015, A1 Tr.K.Sekar and A2 Tr.G.Thangadurai entered in to a criminal conspiracy with dishonest intention to defraud the funds of the Government in implementing the activity of Tree Cultivation in Private Land under the scheme Tamilnadu Bio-Diversity Conservation and Greening Project. In pursuance of the criminal conspiracy, A2 caused to prepare false documents viz., vouchers and petty contractor's memos in the name of fictitious persons and forging the signature of some individuals to believe that they were paid a total sum of Rs.4,21,096/- in the guise of petty contractors towards transportation of plant seedlings from Forest Extension centre Nursery located at Athanur to the place of farmers and towards digging pits and plantation and thereby they dishonestly misappropriated the said sum of Rs.4,21,096/- and caused loss to the Government exchequer. Thereby, A1 and A2 committed the offences u/s 120-B, 167, 468, 471, 477-A, 420, 409 of IPC and sec. 13(2) r/w 13(1) (c) & (d) of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988.

The above information clearly makes out a prima facie case against A1 and A2 for commission of offences u/s 120-B, 167, 409, 420, 468, 471, 477-A IPC and sec. 13(2) r/w 13(1) (c) and (d) of the Prevention of Corruption Act 1988. Hence, I registered a case in Namakkal V&AC., Cr.No.9/AC/2018 under above sections against A1 & A2 noted in the margin and further investigation of this case was entrusted to Selvi.P.Thangamani, Inspector of Police, Vigilance and Anti-Corruption, Salem Detachment as per the orders of the Directorate of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption, Chennai. The original F.I.R. was sent to the Hon'ble court of Special Judge/Chief Judicial Magistrate, Namakkal and copies were sent to the officers concerned.
