

PRESS NOTE

On 03.01.2018 at 18.00 hrs one complaint was received from Tr.N.Saranraj, Age 28, S/o.Nagaraj, No.47, Panaiyathamman Nagar, Poonamallee, Chennai-56. The complainant and his brother are working as acting drivers. The complainant's father Tr.Nagaraj worked as Weigh-man in Mangadu Ration shop. He was expired on 06.03.2014. On 06.06.2017, the complainant along with his mother and brother approached the A.O Tr.Balakrishnan, Managing Director, Sriperumbudur Agriculture Producer Co-operative Marketing Society Limited (No.G 1253) situated at Nasarathpet, Kamarajar Salai, Poonamallee and gave petition for making arrangements to get the job (since complainant's father was expired) and also to get the Group Insurance amount and EL amount. The A.O refused to accept the petition and demanded Rs.2 lakhs for getting job for complainant's brother and Rs.20,000/- for getting Group Insurance amount and EL amount. In mean while the complainant want to meet the A.O, but he did not available in the office in those times. On 27.12.2017, he again met the A.O at his office and gave the petition, but the A.O reiterated his earlier demand. The A.O demanded an initial amount of Rs.10,000/- for getting Group Insurance amount and demanded to give another Rs.10,000/- after getting cheque by the complainant. Similarly the A.O demanded an initial amount of Rs.50,000/- for getting job for his brother and demanded another Rs.50,000/- after getting job by the complainant's brother. The complainant expressed his inability to give such a huge amount to A.O. At that time the A.O asked the complainant to given Rs.10,000/- as initial amount for getting Group Insurance amount and he will do the other things later.

A trap was organized and the accused officer Tr.Balakrishnan, Managing Director reiterated his earlier demand of Rs.10,000/- and accepted the same on 09.01.2018 at his office. The accused was arrested on 09.01.2018 and has been sent to remand by the Hon'ble Chief Judicial Magistrate cum Special Judge, Chengalpattu. The Case is under investigation.
